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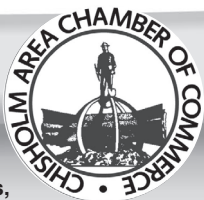


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Dear Fairgoers and Participants,

GENERAL INFORMATION

GATE HOURS

Gates will be opened to visitors:

Wednesday 3 pm - 11 pm

Thursday - Saturday 11 am - 11 pm

Sunday 11 am - 6 pm

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS-All persons wishing to remain on the grounds overnight must make prior arrangements with the fair office.

GENERAL-The management will consider it a kindness if persons will report, to the Secretary/Manager, any mistreatment or extortion practiced on the grounds. They also ask for immediate information regarding the sale of intoxicating liquor or substances or any questionable or demoralizing activity.

Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. No entrances or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way. The designated location is outside of the east fence line by the North (green) gate on the north side of the service road.

Do not wait until the Fair is over to make complaints-report immediately.

Exhibits will be accepted from St. Louis and adjoining counties. There are NO county restrictions in Divisions A, B, C, F, H-1, H-2, H-3.

GENERAL RULES AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. The St. Louis County Agricultural Society reserves to its Board the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.
2. The Board reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as they, in their judgement, may deem advisable.
3. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules, will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Governing Board may order.
4. All exhibits with the exception of some livestock, are to remain until 6 p.m. Sunday. (Exceptions listed under individual Division rules.)

- ATTENTION NON-ANIMAL EXHIBITORS: You may remove exhibits starting at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. However, no vehicles will be permitted thru the gates between 5:00 & 7:00 p.m.**
- Exhibits in all departments, except livestock, must be raised or made by the exhibitor. Anyone purchasing material for exhibition purposes shall forfeit all premiums.
 - No awarding committee shall award any discretionary premiums. Whenever articles of superior merit are exhibited for which no premiums have been offered, the awarding committee may enter the same as “recommended” on the book of awards so the Secretary may report the same to the Board for future action.
 - NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER MORE THAN ONE ITEM IN ANY LOT, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED UNDER INDIVIDUAL DIVISIONS.
 - The “Not Listed Above” Lot is ONLY for entries which do not fit into a listed lot or a contest.
 - A single entry in any lot does not guarantee a blue ribbon placing.
 - Entry and judging times are listed under individual Divisions, and on the back cover of this premium list.
 - All 4-H rules must be followed.

EXHIBITOR GATE POLICY

Exhibitors may purchase General Gate Passes. These are non-transferrable and will only be available at the time an exhibitor registers for their exhibitor number. Purchase of a General Gate pass is NOT mandatory.

Exhibitor Pass: Limit ONE per exhibitor. (Allows unlimited walk-in privileges.) 16-61 years old - \$20. Seniors (62+), Youth (5-15 years of age), Veterans - \$10. Must be an Open Class exhibitor to purchase. 4-H exhibitors will be provided a pass through the 4-H office.

Pass/Park Permit: Limit of TWO Pass/Park Permits per family, (allows driver and vehicle to pass through gate and park vehicle inside the gate. ALL passengers in the vehicle will need a pass or ticket, or they will have to pay the gate keeper to enter.) Green P/P permit will allow you to enter the North Gate, Pink P/P permit will allow you to enter the South Gate. Cost - \$45 per permit. Deadline to purchase permits is July 15th. Purchases may be made through the Fair office, please call 218-263-4256.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FAIR ENTRIES

- “Who can enter items in the St. Louis County Fair?”** Anyone who resides in St. Louis County or an adjoining county may enter items in the Open Class. There are no county restrictions in Div. A, B, C, F & H. Only 4-H members may enter items in 4-H Classes. There are no age restrictions on entering. In fact, there are special open classes and contests that are for youth and senior citizens only.
- “What is an Open Class?”** Classes that are open for entry by anyone that has created an item or has an animal that meets the class and lot description. All items entered must be the work of the person entering it. It is not acceptable to enter a gift you received or a purchased item. The other types of classes are 4-H classes which only accept entries from members of 4-H.
- “Is there a fee to enter?”** There are no fees in the non-livestock divisions. Some livestock divisions do require an entry fee or pen fee to help defray the cost of feed and bedding. If a fee is required, that information will be located under that division’s section in the Exhibitor’s Guide. Pen fees may be waived for animals entered in 4-H judging.
- “How do I enter?”** All items or animals should be pre-registered on-line through the Fair Entry program. This can be accessed through the Fair’s website – www.stlofair.org. If the exhibitor cannot access this, the list of items, along with the exhibitor’s information can be brought to the Fair office for assistance.
- “How do I know what can be entered?”** This Exhibitor’s Guide contains lists of Open and 4-H Classes. The lists in the Open Class divisions give the classes and lots for entries. If you have questions about where an item fits or need other information related to exhibits, contact the Division Superintendent named in the Exhibitor’s Guide. If you are entering animals, it is a good idea to check with the Division Superintendent to see what shots and health certificates may be required.
- “What if my item does not fit anything in the lists?”** Most classes have a lot called “Not Listed Above.” If your item fits in a class but there is no specific lot or contest that it will fit in, enter it in the “Not Listed Above” lot.
- “Does every entry get a ribbon?”** Entries in Open Classes may or may not receive a ribbon. Ribbons are usually awarded to the top three items in a lot. A single entry in a lot does not guarantee a blue ribbon placing. Some classes also award Grand and Reserve Champion Rosettes (ribbons). These are awarded to the top two entries in the entire Class.
- “Do I get money if I win a ribbon?”** Yes. The prize money for a ribbon is called the

“premium”. Premium amounts are listed with the lots. There are usually no monetary awards for Grand and Reserve ribbons.

- “When can I pick up my item?”** The items you enter must remain on display at the Fair until 6 pm on Sunday (the last day of the Fair). Be sure to bring the copy of the “entry log(s)” issued to you when you entered the item(s).
- “When are premium checks handed out?”** Premium checks are issued between 6 pm and 7 pm on Sunday (last day of Fair) at the Customer Service Kiosk by the Main Gate. The procedure is to turn in your Exhibitor Number card and you will be given your check. Checks which are not claimed during the specified time period, will be mailed out the week after the Fair. If you remove your item before 6 pm on Sunday (last day of Fair), you will automatically forfeit your premium for that item.
- “What if there’s a mistake in my premium check?”** Mistakes should be brought to the attention of the person issuing the checks. You will be asked to complete a “Check Error” form which will be attached to your check and returned to the Fair Office. The error will be confirmed through the “Judge’s Books”, and if necessary a new check will be issued and mailed to you.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT JUDGING OF OPEN CLASS EXHIBITS

- “Can I watch the judging?”** Non-livestock Open Class and some small animal judging is usually completed before the gates open to the public on the first day of the Fair. In all cases, non-livestock judging is closed to the public and to exhibitors. Large animal judging (cattle, sheep, goats, etc.) that is done during regular Fair hours is always open to the public. In fact, the public is encouraged to attend these interesting and educational judging sessions.
- “Does the judge know whose entry they’re judging?”** In the non-livestock divisions, entries are kept anonymous by using Exhibitor numbers instead of names. Livestock entries are presented in a show ring, by the exhibitor, so the judge does know whose entry they are judging.
- “Can I help with the judging?”** Possibly. If you feel you are qualified to judge a particular division, you should contact the Fair Office (218-263-4256). If you are not qualified to judge, but would still like to be part of the judging process by helping tag entries and organize them for judging, attach ribbons after the judging, or help with the final tallying, you should contact the Fair Office and let them know which division you would like to volunteer your time and talents in.
- “Who does the judging?”** The Fair Board looks for people with knowledge and must be credentialed by a sanctioning body so the exhibitor can earn points towards a year end standing. The judges may change from year to year or every couple years. It depends on availability. Judges do not make entries in any areas they judge.
- “Where do the judges come from?”** Most non-livestock judges come from the immediate area. Most livestock judges come from out of the area. Some are from the southern part of the state.

MEMO TO NON-ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

In an effort to create more diversified exhibits at the fair, some entries may be displayed in a Division other than the one they are entered in. (ie. jar of strawberry jam may be displayed with the fresh strawberries in Ag & Hort.) The superintendents of the Division you are entered in will be able to tell you where your entry is being exhibited. Entries will NOT be moved until AFTER judging; and only non-ribbon winning entries will be moved.

All entries will be returned to their original Division prior to the close of the fair. Therefore this change will not have an affect on picking up your exhibits after 6 p.m. on Sunday.

PLEASE INFORM THE SUPERINTENDENT **AT ENTRY TIME**, IF YOU DO NOT WANT YOUR ENTRY MOVED.

The St. Louis County Fair expressly refuses to assume any liability for injuries to any person or damage to any property coming upon the grounds of the St. Louis County Fair, and no claims for injury to any person or damage to property shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the said St. Louis County Fair, its officers, agents or employees for said cause by any person having privilege to exhibit or license to operate on the fairgrounds or occupying any space thereon, and it is a part of the consideration for each license or privilege granted by the St. Louis County Fair that such claims for injury or damage are specifically waived.

If any damage or injury or loss to persons or property shall be caused by reason of neglect or willful act of any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives or employees, having license or permit to exhibit or operate a business or occupy space on the St. Louis County Fair site, the St. Louis County Fair shall in no manner be responsible therefore, and in any area will not be subjected to any expense or liability. All persons causing same are liable and therefore shall indemnify the St. Louis County Fair.

LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES

1. Livestock or poultry known by the exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease, or to be from a quarantined herd or flock, may not be entered in an exhibition. WARTS AND RINGWORM are considered communicable diseases. Therefore, livestock affected by these diseases cannot be exhibited. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is NOT acceptable.
2. All livestock will be inspected by the Official Veterinarian on the opening day of the exhibition and daily during the exhibition. The official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantine facility or removal from the exhibition premises of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases. Animals placed in a quarantine facility must remain there until removed from the exhibition premises. They may not enter a show ring. This includes livestock with WARTS or RINGWORM.
3. **A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST WILL BE REQUIRED FOR ALL HORSES, MULES, DONKEYS AND BURROS ENTERING THE ST. LOUIS COUNTY FAIR SITE. A COGGINS TEST GIVEN WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF THE FAIR WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
4. Livestock and poultry entered in a petting exhibit are not exempt from the exhibition rules if the animals are from more than one farm or there are other animals at the exhibit.
5. **ARRANGEMENTS FOR TESTING OF HORSES MUST BE MADE AT LEAST 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO ENTRY DAY.**
6. Exhibitors must abide by MN Board of Animal Health rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of animals. Exhibitors must familiarize themselves with the regulations by calling 651-296-2942 or by visiting the Board of Animal Health website at www.bah.state.mn.us.
7. 4-H members may enter their animal in open class, if they meet the regulations, even though they or some other family members may have another animal entered in the same lot in open class. The regulations are that any 4-H livestock entry, except horses, that is entered in a 4-H class, must win a blue ribbon in that 4-H Class in order for the animal to advance to open class judging.
8. All animals must be in "Show" condition to be acceptable for entry.
9. Certificate of registry or proof of breeding must be furnished to the Superintendent on demand.
10. Exhibitors must keep their barns and stalls open and stock uncovered between the hours of 11 a.m. and 10 p.m. during each day of the fair. (11 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday).
11. ***Each Livestock exhibitor will be responsible for the feeding, watering and care of their own stock, and must keep the space in the rear of their stalls and alleyways, in the barns, clear and clean.*** All litter must be thrown where directed by the Superintendent.
12. Straw will be available for bedding in all large animal divisions. Hay for cattle, sheep & goats will be available.
13. The St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association reserves the right to turn away any animal.

As a Member of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, The St. Louis County Fair supports the I.A.F.E. Show Ring Code of Ethics and requests all animal exhibitors to abide by this code. A copy of the I.A.F.E. Show Ring Code of Ethics will be posted in each animal barn. - Stalls must be kept clean. Stalls should be kept in "show condition" at all times. It is up to you to clean your stall and the aisle-way in front of it.
- All horse washing is to be done only IN the wash rack.
- The wash area must be kept clean and clear.
- You must bring your own equipment for cleaning. If you are found to have not cleaned up after your horse, you will be made to do so before your next class. A horse must never be tied to a stall and left alone. They must be groomed and tacked up in the stalls. Your trailer areas must also be kept clean. All 4-H stalls must be cleaned and checked (regardless of leaving or staying) within 2 hours after the 4-H show ends. If not cleaned and checked, your premiums will be withheld. 4-H horses may be removed from barn after the 4-H show.
- 4-H horses come on Wednesday - leave by noon Friday.
- Stalling fee will be \$25.00 plus \$10 cleaning fee.** All fees mailed to the Fair Office; P.O. Box 627, Chisholm, MN 55719
- Stalls may be reserved starting June 1st on a first come first served basis. Reservations will be considered confirmed when payment is received.

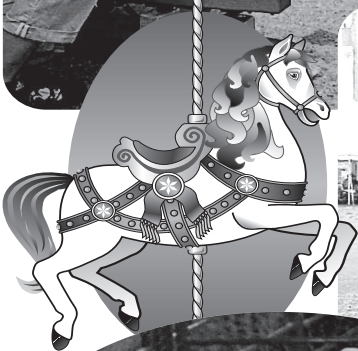

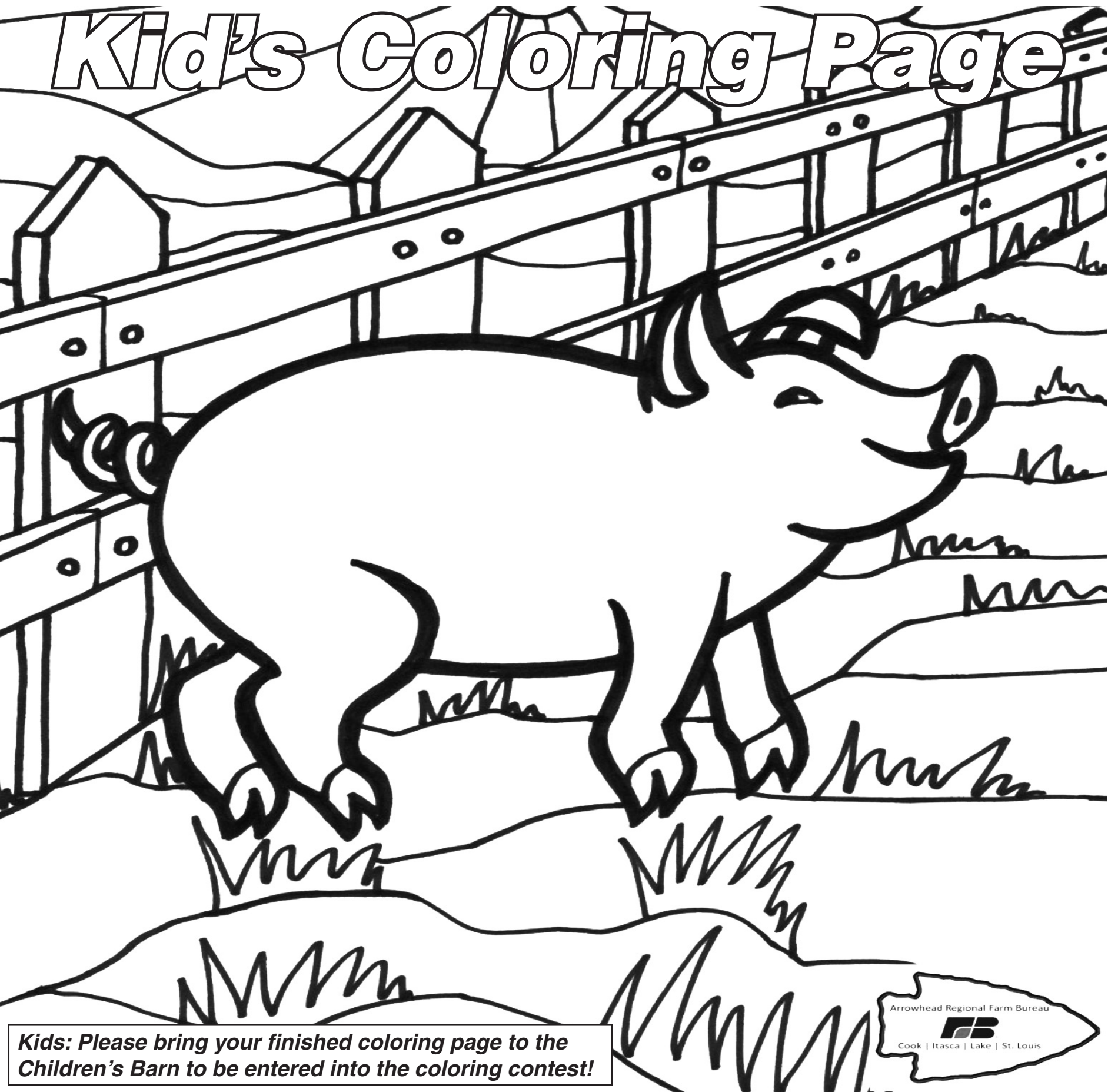
